The names of the Hall of Fame members, as well as busts and portraits of these individuals, can be seen at the Gaylord-Pickens Oklahoma Heritage Museum. In addition, the inductees are recognized on granite monuments in the Heritage Plaza at the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds.

The class of 2008, which is the Hall of Fame's 81st, joins a cast of 621 individuals who have been inducted into the Hall of Fame since 1928.

Donna Nigh is a former Oklahoma first lady who is acclaimed for her commitment to Oklahomans with special needs. Robert Henry has served in every branch of government. He is currently serving as the Chief Judge of the U.S.

Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit. Ron Norick served as mayor of Oklahoma City, 1987-98, and is often referred to as the "Father of MAPS."
