# Filmmakers want to capture Oklahomans' stories

Every person has a story, whether it is pulled from family history or lived experience, and the Oklahoma Heritage Association wants to hear it.

Northern Light Productions, a production company based in Boston, will have a documentary video crew filming folks and their stories at Garman Studios in Oklahoma City on Saturday.

The footage will be included in an interactive exhibit about Oklahomans to be screened at the Oklahoma Heritage Association's new hall of fame museum when it opens in May, said John Cianfrani, an associate producer for Northern Light.

The film crew is looking for "all kinds of different experiences, different people, different stories," Cianfrani said.

Anyone interested in being part of the project should call Cianfrani at (857) 389-2992 to schedule an appointment and interview.

Those who have appointments will be filmed at Garman Studios between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Cianfrani will schedule an appointment and provide the studio address. The interviews will last about 30 minutes.

So far, he has taken many calls from people who want their grandparents to talk about the early days of statehood, but Cianfrani said he is also interested in all points of history and experiences — from county fairs and landmarks to first loves, adventures and hardship.
